

Structure of Department Southeast Europe and Turkey




KfW's Presence in Southeast Europe and Turkey Regional Overview



KfW's Approach

Why is the topic relevant in the region?

EU-rapprochement process

- Less than 10 % of solid waste and 25 % of waste water are sustainably
- Cities of WB6 are substantial greenhouse gas emitters

Guiding Principles

- > Support of reform and EU-rapprochement
- WB6 as preferred BMZ regional climate partner
- > Goal of urban infrastructure conforming to EU-standards
- Focus on Circular Economy (Water/Waste), urban resilience, efficient mobility / social building infrastructure
- Integration of BMZ guidelines: Just Transition, digitalization, gender, good governance

Conceptual Approaches

Performance-based Financing


- Operational and organizational strengthening of PUC prior to execution of investment
- High ownership of participating PUC
- PUC are capable of ensuring long-lasting sustainable operations

Program-based Financing

- Basis: national, regional, municipal master plans and concepts/studies
- > Yielding of broad effects in an urban context
- Need-based coverage of a varied mix of topics within the urban context
- Furtherance of livable, sustainable, climate and environmentally-balanced cities

Previous/Existing Projects

Municipal Infrastructure I-V

Larger Cities: Water/Wastewater Network/Treatment Rehabilitation and Extension €230 Mio.

Rural Water Programs I-IV

Smaller cities: Water/Wastewater Network/Treatment Rehabilitation/Extension €36 Mio.

Solid Waste Projects

Region Vlora & Korca: Waste Management/Transport/Transfer/Treatment/ Disposal Systems €40 Mio.



Program Development

Water Sector Performance and Investment Programme (WPIPII)

Larger Cities: Water/Wastewater Network/Treatment Rehabilitation and Extension €70 Mio.

Solid Waste Management Program

Larger Cities: Construction, Rehabilitation and Improvement of Solid Waste Landfills, Transport, Transfer, Treatment Infrastructure €70 Mio.


Rehabilitation Sewage and Stormwater Network / Connector WWTP €62 Mio.
